WHEREAS, The Troop D Auxiliary Club, which originated as an offshoot of Troop D 1<sup>st</sup> New York Cavalry in 1904, became a fixture at the Jefferson Street Armory in Syracuse which was their home and place of training; and

WHEREAS, In 1916 the Troop D 1<sup>st</sup> New York Cavalry was ordered to the Mexican Border, and formed part of the charge against Poncho Villa and his famous Durado Cavalry; and

WHEREAS, The Troop D Cavalry Club and Auxiliary Club were activated again in World War I and World War II, fighting bravely in both wars for their country; and

WHEREAS, In 1965 the Troop D Auxiliary Club turned almost 170 acres of their privately owned land into an eighteen hole golf course and social club, which has entertained such distinguished visitors as Bob Hope; and this year the Cavalry Club celebrates their historic 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary.
