SPRING COMES TO SYRACUSE: CITY RELEASES 2017 YARD WASTE PICKUP SCHEDULE, FIRST PICKUPS HAPPENING APRIL 1

New Schedule Includes 2-Week Initial Spring Clean Up Period, Enabling City Crews to Keep On Schedule

SYRACUSE, N.Y. – The City of Syracuse today released its 2017 Yard Waste and Construction Debris pickup schedule, in time for area residents to start spring cleanup projects. Beginning April 1 and continuing through October, City Department of Public Works (DPW) crews will travel quadrant by quadrant picking up yard waste and construction debris.

Dates of all the pickups can be found below:

City crews will spend two weeks in each quadrant for initial pickups in an effort to keep the rest of the year's schedule on track. Following the full two week spring cleanup schedule, pickups will happen monthly in each quadrant. Yard waste and debris should be set out between the sidewalk and the curb on the dates specified. Quadrant pickup will happen during that week. Set outs should not be in the street nor should they block fire hydrants or sewer vents.

Brush and leaves should be separated but do not need to be bagged. Residents should keep their yard waste separate from construction debris and typical household trash and recycling. Residents must limit their pickups to two cubic yards – the size of a standard washer and dryer, side by side.
