Mayor Stephanie A. Miner's State of the City Address to be Held Jan. 26 at The Landmark Theatre

Syracuse, NY – Mayor Stephanie A. Miner's third State of the City Address will be held Thursday, Jan. 26 at the Landmark Theatre on Salina Street. The event is free and open to the public.

"The Landmark Theatre is very pleased to be part of the State of the City Address. It is an exciting time for Downtown Syracuse with many new projects opening and bringing people to Salina Street," said Denise DiRienzo, Executive Director of the Landmark Theatre. "We reopened November 19, 2011 after a long-awaited expansion that will help spur economic growth on Salina Street. We anticipate being 'lit' over 150 nights in 2012 and look forward to the economic success that will bring for the shops, restaurants and garages around us."

"The Landmark represents the best of Syracuse – our rich history and our willingness to evolve to ensure a better future," said Syracuse Mayor Stephanie A. Miner. "I am honored to address the Syracuse community at the Landmark Theatre this year as downtown's transformation continues."

Light refreshments will be served at 5:30 p.m. in the Landmark Theatre lobby. The State of the City program will begin at 6:30 p.m.

On-street parking is available. Paid parking is available in the Atrium Garage and the Clinton Street Garage, as well as in open air lots on Clinton Street. Parking spots for people with disabilities are available on Salina and Jefferson Streets, adjacent to the Landmark Theatre. Aurora of CNY will provide sign language interpreting for the hearing impaired.

The City of Syracuse Charter requires the Mayor to present an annual message regarding the state of the City to the Syracuse Common Council. The State of the City Address was held at the SUNY College of Environmental Science and Forestry in 2010 and at the Everson Museum of Art in 2011.

The Landmark Theatre underwent a \$16 million renovation in 2010 and 2011. The renovations include a new box office, a new and expanded stage, new dressing and rehearsal rooms and electrical improvements.
